Opening

Chairperson Blowers called the meeting to order and requested a moment of silence followed by the pledge to the flag.

BOARD ACTION NO. 2: CONSENT AGENDA: MOTION TO AUTHORIZE AND APPROVE:

Chairperson Blowers opened the floor to the Board for a motion to approve the actions set forth on the Consent Agenda.

Daniel Youngs, Executive Director

Mr. Youngs provided an operational and administrative report, noting that April continued the positive trends seen in March, with higher-than-expected waste tonnage and strong system performance contributing to favorable financial outcomes. He highlighted the initiation of ash diversion under a beneficial reuse agreement with Greater Lebanon Refuse Authority, under which 33 loads totaling approximately 745 tons had been delivered as of the meeting date. This program supports landfill capacity preservation while providing regional material needs. Updates were also provided on the Northeast Lancaster Transfer Campus (NLTC) project, including land development planning, permitting progress, engineering procurement, and ongoing coordination across internal teams and project stakeholders. Initial outreach to nearby property owners was conducted, with constructive feedback received. Mr.



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Youngs further noted ongoing public education efforts, including a recent media feature done by Janine James highlighting waste-to-energy operations and related outreach campaigns.

Mr. Youngs introduced an action item for approval, which was a resolution to adopt the 2026-2028 Strategic Plan. The plan had been previously presented at April's meeting and included a minor revision to emphasize landfill capacity planning and potential land acquisition. A copy of the action item is attached.

BOARD ACTION NO. 3: RESOLUTION 2026-05: ADOPTING THE 2026-2028 STRATEGIC PLAN

Chairperson Blowers opened the floor to the Board for a motion to approve the action.

Richard Bennett, Director of Finance

Mr. Bennett presented the April financial report, noting inbound tonnage exceeded budget and resulted in strong revenue performance. Operating revenues exceeded budget, while expenditures remained generally consistent with projections, with higher fuel costs offset by favorable variances in other categories. Operating income remained favorable, and unrestricted reserves declined very slightly following planned capital expenditures.

Nick Kohr, Director of Engineering

Mr. Kohr introduced an action item for approval, which was a resolution to authorize the execution of a contract modification for upgraded crane control systems at the Susquehanna Resource Management Complex. It was noted that upgrades are necessary to replace aging, unsupported equipment, and ensure long-term reliability of operations. A copy of the action item is attached.

BOARD ACTION NO. 4: RESOLUTION 2026-06: AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF MODIFICATION NUMBER 2026-02 IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-TWO THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED AND NINETY-SEVEN DOLLARS (\$172,697.00) FOR SRMC UPGRADED CRANE CONTROLS AND TWO UPGRADED CRANE CHAIRS

Chairperson Blowers opened the floor to the Board for a motion to approve the action.

Mr. Kohr provided updates on several capital projects, including completion of the induced draft fan replacement at the Lancaster Waste-to-Energy Facility and continued progress on landfill projects, including road improvements and capping activities.

Mr. Kohr then presented a focus topic on the results of a rail feasibility study examining long-term waste transport options. The study concluded that while rail transport provides viable long-term disposal capacity and cost benefits compared to long distance truck hauling, current Authority facilities present significant limitations for implementation. Staff will continue to evaluate alternative locations and regional opportunities for potential rail integration.



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Nicole Roy, Director of Risk Management

Ms. Roy introduced a focus topic regarding a preliminary initiative to explore captive insurance solutions as a strategic tool to support an intergovernmental framework aligned with the Authority's strategic objectives. The initiative would begin with a feasibility study to assess overall viability, potential captive structures and governance models, while maintaining separation from and protection of the Authority's current risk structure. The Board expressed support for proceeding with the feasibility study.

Michelle Marsh, Director of Sustainability

Ms. Marsh introduced an action item for approval, which was a resolution to approve an amended leachate agreement with the Lancaster Area Sewer Authority to secure additional treatment capacity. Ms. Marsh explained that early acquisition of capacity provides long-term operational flexibility, cost certainty, and risk mitigation, particularly in support of future landfill planning. The Board discussed contractual provisions related to capacity usage and availability. A copy of the action item is attached.

BOARD ACTION NO. 5: RESOLUTION 2026-07: AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING AN AMENDED LEACHATE DISPOSAL AGREEMENT WITH THE LANCASTER AREA SEWER AUTHORITY, WITH AN EFFECTIVE DATE OF JANUARY 1, 2027, TO PURCHASE AN ADDITIONAL 130,000 GPD OF CAPACITY FOR A PURCHASE PRICE OF \$2,717,000.00, PAYABLE OVER TEN YEARS, AND EXTEND THE DURATION OF THE EXISTING AGREEMENT

Chairperson Blowers opened the floor to the Board for a motion to approve the action which provides the Executive Director with the authorization to execute the Agreement with such changes as are in the best interest of the Authority.

Adopted: Unanimously

Ms. Marsh introduced Carlyn Fryberger who presented a focus topic on the 2025 recycling performance report. Ms. Fryberger noted that total recycling tonnage increased approximately 6% year over year, resulting in a countywide recycling rate of 50.8%. Growth was primarily driven by increased commercial activity and improved reporting, while residential participation remained stable due to strong access to curbside programs. Additional trends included increases in paper, metals, and organics recycling, as well as continued growth in electronics and battery management efforts. She also noted evolving regulatory considerations and the importance of continued data improvement and public education.

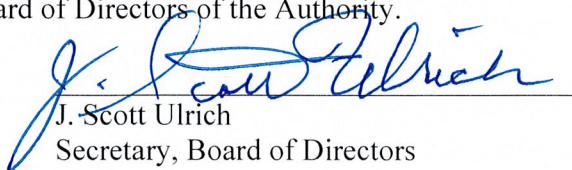

Modification Number 2026-02

Effective May 16, 2026, Reworld Harrisburg, Inc. f/k/a Covanta Harrisburg, Inc. ("Reworld") and Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority (the "Authority"), parties to a certain Master Professional Services Agreement, dated as of January 1, 2018, (the "Agreement"), have entered into this Modification Number 2026-02 (this "Modification").

Background

LCSWMA and Reworld have been working to improve the speed and reliability of the refuse cranes at the Susquehanna Resource Management Complex (the "Facility"). As a final step for these improvements, Reworld has recommended the design, fabrication, and installation of two upgraded crane chairs which incorporate the crane controls, along with certain related improvements as detailed in the proposal attached to this Modification as Exhibit "A" (the "Proposal").

The work described in the Proposal (the "Project") is an Upgrade Project, not a Listed Project, nor a Recurring Project, nor an Operations and Maintenance Expense. The Project is to be completed by December 2026.

THEREFORE, the Authority and Reworld, intending to be legally bound and upon the exchange of good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is mutually acknowledged, agree as follows:

1. This is a Reworld Modification pursuant to Sections 5.13 and 5.16 of the Harrisburg Appendix to the Agreement. Each of the capitalized terms not defined in this Modification has the meaning set forth in the Agreement. This Modification shall also be Reworld's Proposal Cost Estimate, Reworld's Modification Proposal, the Authority's approval of Reworld's Modification Proposal, and the Authority's Notice to Proceed.
2. The Project is more specifically described in the Proposal. The services to be completed by or on behalf of Reworld pursuant to this Modification (the "Project Services") will include all work and materials necessary for the design, procurement of all required project materials and work, installation, contract management, startup, and successful completion of testing of the Project in accordance with the acceptance criteria for an Upgrade Project. Reworld shall complete the Modification (including any appropriate testing) during 2026.

3. Reworld shall contract for the installation and implementation of the Project under this Modification, including but not limited to, all work, labor and materials for the design, procurement of all required materials, installation, project management, permit fees and startup, as necessary or appropriate. All Project warranties shall be for the benefit of the Authority.
4. The cost of the Proposal is \$172,697.00. The Authority has agreed that the Authority will bear the cost of the Project. Reworld has agreed to waive any management fee as some of the resulting benefits, such as improved ergonomics, will benefit Reworld. Accordingly, the Authority shall pay Reworld the price of One Hundred Seventy-Two Thousand Six Hundred and Ninety-Seven Dollars (\$172,697.00) for the Project plus sales and/or use tax (if the tax is not exempt from payment under the Facility's tax exemption status). Under Reworld's vendor's purchase terms, twenty percent (20%) is due at the time the purchase order is issued to the vendor, forty percent (40%) is due upon signed vendor approvals, thirty percent (30%) is due upon the vendor's receipt of materials, and the remaining ten percent (10%) due at time of final installation and acceptance. Given the substantial lead time involved, the Authority has agreed to pay Reworld when and as the vendor progress payments are due, subject to Substantiated Cost.
5. No additional operation, maintenance and other costs will arise from operation of the Project. The Annual Base Service Fee in section 1.01 of the Agreement shall not be changed.
6. Reworld and the Authority agree to the following terms regarding the design and construction of the Project:
 - 6.1. The preparation for installation of the Project shall occur as needed for completion by the December 2026 timeframe, subject to the availability of materials. Installation, startup, and performance testing of the Project will not require total Facility shutdown or individual process train shutdown periods.
 - 6.2. Reworld shall provide all design and construction management services as part of the estimated price: but Reworld will not charge a Management Fee.
7. Installation and operation of the Project provided under this Modification does not diminish, abrogate, or otherwise affect any of Reworld's obligations, covenants, guarantees or representations under the Agreement.

8. This Modification reflects the entire agreement between the parties concerning the Project and supersedes and replaces all prior oral or written negotiations, agreements, or understandings, with respect to the matters set forth in this Modification. The Authority and Reworld ratify and confirm the Agreement as amended by this Modification.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Authority and Reworld, intending to be legally bound, have caused this Modification to be executed by their duly authorized representatives and thereby make it effective as of the date set forth above.

WHEREAS, it will be beneficial to LCSWMA if LCSWMA and LASA agree to execute the Amended Leachate Disposal Agreement, with an effective date of January 1, 2027, and a purchase price of \$2,717,000.00 payable over ten years, as stated and attached as Exhibit "1" to this Resolution (the "Amended Agreement").

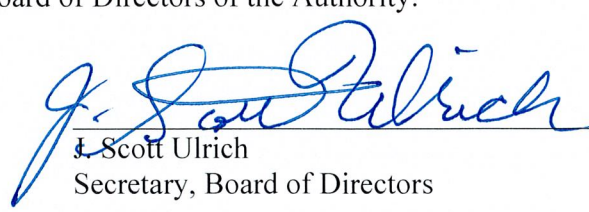

Amended Leachate Disposal Agreement

This Amended Leachate Disposal Agreement ("Agreement") is between the Lancaster Area Sewer Authority ("LASA") and the Lancaster County Solid Waste Management Authority ("LCSWMA").¹ Effective **January 1, 2027**, LASA shall provide leachate treatment to LCSWMA in accordance with the following:

SITE:	Frey Farm Landfill, 3049 River Road, Conestoga, PA (the "Landfill")
WASTE:	Municipal Waste Landfill Leachate
CAPACITY:	LCSWMA currently possesses an allocation of capacity to discharge 40,000 gallons per day (gpd) average flow as measured on an annual basis. In addition to the foregoing, an additional one hundred thirty thousand (130,000) gpd will be purchased by LCSWMA for a one-time tapping fee of Two Million Seven Hundred Seventeen Thousand Dollars (\$2,717,000.00) and the aggregated 170,000 gpd capacity will be available to LCSWMA upon execution of this agreement. LCSWMA will pay this fee over ten (10) years subject to: (1) an annual fixed interest rate of 2.5% on the unpaid balance; and (2) continued delivery of leachate to LASA. The initial ten percent will be due on or before January 1, 2027. The remaining annual payments (including interest) will be made each subsequent year on or before January 31. LCSWMA will have the option to pay the balance at any time without penalty. LCSWMA's capacity allocation cannot be reduced or uncommitted by LASA.
LEACHATE:	LCSWMA agrees that the discharge shall meet all of the conditions in LCSWMA's LASA-issued discharge permit and LASA's Rules and Regulations.
SURCHARGE PARAMETER AND TOTAL NITROGEN FEES:	LCSWMA agrees to comply with LASA's local limits (LASA Code 60-14) and the parameters that are subject to surcharges per LASA Code 60-45. In the event that LCSWMA cannot comply with said limits, LCSWMA shall, at its sole cost, install and maintain pretreatment facilities as reasonably required to achieve compliance. LCSWMA agrees to pay the BOD, TSS, Total Phosphorus and Total Nitrogen surcharge fees applicable to other LASA customers. LCSWMA understands that these fees change periodically and agrees to pay fee increases as approved

¹ This Agreement is the successor agreement to the Leachate Disposal Agreement entered into on November 29, 2023, which is effective from January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2026.

	by LASA's Board of Directors. LCSWMA may, at its discretion, sample for these parameters at a frequency greater than quarterly.
VOLUME CHARGES:	LCSWMA's base charge for leachate treatment will be calculated using LASA's established volume-based rates for commercial/industrial waste customers. LASA will invoice LCSWMA quarterly for leachate processing and disposal. Payment shall be due by the thirtieth day after each statement date. LCSWMA agrees to a 600 gpm maximum flow rate on the leachate discharge. If LCSWMA fails to use any portion of its capacity allocation, LASA will not charge LCSWMA for any unused capacity.
TERM:	The initial term of this Agreement shall be from January 1, 2027 through December 31, 2036, provided however that so long as the tapping fee is paid as agreed the capacity allocation does not expire at the end of the initial or any subsequent term. Thereafter the Agreement can be renewed upon mutual agreement, under the same terms and conditions, for up to an additional three (3) year term beginning January 1 of the additional year. Intent to renew the Agreement shall be given no less than 120 days prior to expiration.

Standard Conditions

1. **Indemnity by LASA.** LASA shall indemnify and hold harmless LCSWMA from all costs, claims and expenses arising by reason of LASA's negligent or wrongful acts or omissions relating to this Agreement or LASA's breach of this Agreement. The rights and obligations of the parties pursuant to this paragraph shall survive a termination of this Agreement.
2. **Indemnity by LCSWMA.** LCSWMA shall indemnify and hold harmless LASA from all costs, claims and expenses arising by reason of LCSWMA's negligent or wrongful acts or omissions relating to this Agreement or LCSWMA's breach of this Agreement. The rights and obligations of the parties pursuant to this paragraph shall survive a termination of this Agreement.
3. **Force Majeure.** LASA and LCSWMA shall be relieved and discharged of their respective obligations under this Agreement to the extent that performance thereof is materially and adversely affected by any cause beyond their control which shall include: earthquake, severe and unusual weather conditions, epidemic, landslide,

fire, explosion, failure of utilities, nuclear radiation, act of public enemy, war, blockade, insurrection, riot or civil disturbance, strike or labor interruption, extortion or sabotage.

4. **Miscellaneous.** This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Any disputes shall be resolved by non-jury trial in the Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, Court of Common Pleas or the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. LASA and LCSWMA hereby consent to such jurisdiction and venue and irrevocably waive any right to jury trial which may exist.
